FIRST SUNDAY OF Advent

'Advent means 'coming'. During Advent we celebrate God's love for us through the birth of Christ. Christmas embraces the past through Jesus' birth; the Holy Spirit present in the Church today; and, God's promise of His second coming in the future.

LIGHTING OF THE CANDLE - THE CANDLE OF HOPE

Our hope is that we are prepared for the coming of Christ. We light the first candle, the candle of hope, to express our longing for peace, for healing and the well-being of all creation.

We pray together: Almighty God, give us grace that we may cast away the works of darkness, and put upon us the armor of light, now in the time of this mortal life in which thy Son Jesus Christ came to visit us in great humility; that in the last day, when he shall come again in his glorious majesty to judge both the quick and the dead, we may rise to the life immortal; through him who liveth and reigneth with thee and the Holy Ghost, one God, now and for ever.......AMEN.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

(Taken from Pastoral Liturgy)

Our Gospel reading, made from two passages from the one chapter in Luke, aligns with our first two readings. In this, two Advent themes are brought to the fore. The Christ will return, and consequently live now so that you may stand before God. Yet this is a stark reading, with apocalyptic currents and a degree of despair. In a way, the evangelist has Jesus addressing the Christian community of the future. Just as in Luke's Gospel Jesus soon will face his passion, so will the future church soon enough face a time of trial and passion of its own.

In response, the Gospel teller is calling his hearers to live within the actual moment, to be aware of what is around, to avoid escapism, to wait upon the Lord.

Feast Days this week

Tues 30 Nov—St Andrew - Born at Bethsaida (Galilee), he was a fisherman and introduced his brother, Simon Peter, to Jesus and became one of the first to follow Christ. Widely venerated since ancient times and remembered as one of the twelve who bore witness to the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus.

Fri 3 Dec—St Francis Xavier—Born in 1506 in Spain. Travelled extensively through southeast Asia to Japan winning many converts and leaving behind organised Christian communities. Remembered for the witness of his poverty and for his tireless efforts as a missionary. He died in 1552 off the coast of China.


