

GOSPEL REFLECTION

By Fr Michael Tate (Taken from Pastoral Liturgy)

Pope Francis embodies the spirit of today's Gospel. He rails against a Church exhibiting 'the leprosy of a feudal court'. Rather, he has said: 'I see the Church as a field hospital after battle. Heal the wounds, heal the wounds.' And in his actions he has shown himself as a true 'Servant of the servants of God' as Jesus commands in today's Gospel.

We may pause for a moment to pray for Pope Francis that he may have the strength and time to persevere in his responding to today's Gospel so that the papacy may be truly liberated so as to practise a radically different way of exercising leadership in the Church and for the world.

Mon 18 Oct—St Luke—By early Christian tradition, Luke is named as author of the Third Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles. He was almost certainly a Gentile and perhaps a companion of St Paul. In his Gospel, the compassion of Christ is inclusive of all: Gentile and Jew, the poor and the rich, women and men, the outcast and the privileged.

Excerpts from this week's 'Record' First Plenary Council Assembly 'inspiring'

Perth Archbishop Timothy Costelloe SDB has reflected on a week that had been "inspiring, challenging and sometimes unsettling" following closure of the formal proceedings of the First General Assembly of the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia on Saturday 9 October. As the Plenary Council President, Archbishop Costelloe adjourned the First Assembly and summoned its 278 members to gather again in July 2022 for the Second and Final assembly.

A Reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark 10: 35-45

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, approached Jesus. 'Master' they said to him, 'we want you to do us a favour.' He said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' They said to him, 'Allow us to sit one at your right hand and the other at your left in your glory. 'You do not know what you are asking Jesus said to them. 'Can you drink the cup that I must drink, or be baptised with the baptism with which I must be baptised?' They replied, 'We can.' Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I must drink you shall drink, and with the baptism with which I must be baptised you shall be baptised, but as for seats at my right hand or my left, these are not mine to grant; they belong to those to whom they have been allotted.'

When the other ten heard this they began to feel indignant with James and John, so Jesus called them to him and said to them: 'You know that among the pagans their so-called rulers lord it over them, and their great men make their authority felt. This is not to happen among you. No; anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be first among you must be slave to all. For the Son of Man himself did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.'
