
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

GOSPEL REFLECTION

(Taken from Pastoral Liturgy)

Jesus does not offer us a guarantee of escape from suffering, in fact, Jesus suggests that it comes with following him. Jesus knows well and communicates to his followers that trouble comes with holding to the will of God. He says as much earlier in the same chapter from which our gospel reading comes, warning that believers will be beaten and arraigned before many "because of me" (13:9b).

Jesus' offer is hope and vision where there is none and a promise that all things do pass. Perhaps the knowledge that all things pass is the one thing we know even better when we experience trouble. However, Jesus' word, the saving Word of God, never passes - and this word is spoken to us and holds us all in existence. It is a voice into the dark telling us that there is light on the other side even though we cannot see it. It is a voice into emptiness telling us there is substance even when our feet have no footing. It is a voice of eternal love even when we feel lonely and abandoned. This word transcends time and space. It is ever present even when the world we seem to know is falling apart.

FEAST DAY THIS WEEK

Wed 17 Nov—St Elizabeth of Hungary—Born in Bratislava (Slovakia) in 1207. She was married at the age of fourteen, widowed at twenty and died at twenty four in Germany in 1231. Mother of three children and happily married to Ludwig of Thuringia who died of the plague while on crusade. She continued to protect the poor and founded orphanages and hospitals, living this life as a Franciscan tertiary despite the hostility of her relatives and the harshness of her confessor.

Remembered for her good-humoured resilience in adversity and for her humility in menial service of the needy.

This Sunday, 14th November, is "World Day of the Poor" specially chosen by Pope Francis for the launch of the *Laudato S*i Action Plan across the Catholic world. Let's pray, and see what we each of us and our parish might do.
