

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Women and men are gathered into the community of the saved, primarily because others have been sent out to get them. The psalm refrain is the command to go out to the whole world. The first reading describes God sending fugitives back home to get their relatives. People come from all over because someone is sent to get them. Today that command is directed to us.

We are the ones who are being sent out to bring others to God. Unfortunately there are many people who do not believe that they are fit to be evangelisers. They may think that the work that they do or the lives that they live do not lend themselves to the task of spreading the good news of the gospel. They do not realise that all Christians are called and sent. This is not an option; it is a responsibility.

Feast Days this week.....

Mon 22 Aug—The Queenship of Blessed Virgin Mary—This feast was established by Pius X11 to stress its relationship to the Assumption: taken up into glory, Mary became queen of heaven and earth.


Wed 24 Aug—St Bartholomew—Named in the list of apostles and generally identified with Nathaniel of Cana, the 'Israelite without guile', who was led to Jesus by the apostle Philip. Said to have preached the gospel in India and in Armenia, where tradition dictates he was martyred.

Sat 27 Aug—St Monica—Probably born in Algeria about 331. Before her marriage her faith bore fruit in her recovery from a drinking problem and later helped bring her husband and mother-in-law to Christianity.

She undertook many years of penance and prayer for her brilliant but wayward son, St Augustine. Following his conversion and baptism in Milan, she died at the beginning of her journey home to Africa. Remembered for her parental devotion, her patience, and her persistence in prayer. She died in 387.

A Reading from the letter to the Hebrews 12: 5-7, 11-13

Have you forgotten that encouraging text in which you are addressed as sons? My son, when the Lord corrects you, do not treat it lightly; but do not get discouraged when he reprimands you. For the Lord trains the ones that he loves and he punishes all those that he acknowledges as his sons.

Suffering is part of your training; God is treating you as his sons. Has there ever been any son whose father did not train him? Of course, any punishment is most painful at the time, and far from pleasant; but later, in those on whom it has been used, it bears fruit in peace and goodness. So hold up your limp arms and steady your trembling knees and smooth out the path you tread; then the injured limb will not be wrenched, it will grow strong again.
