



REFLECTION— The Rich Man and Lazarus

The Rich man and Lazarus is a fascinating story told by Jesus. This story is all about the contrast between the two different characters in this story, **the Rich man and Lazrus.**

Jesus doesn't even bother to give the rich man a name in his story. Rather, he let him be a representative for all who live life in such a manner as he did. He makes it clear that this man is living a lavish lifestyle at the expense of others.

This man lived his life adorned in the finest clothes, including purple, which only the wealthiest could afford, and feasting daily. In contrast, there is Lazarus. The only thing that adorned him was sores, and all he had to eat were scraps that fell from the rich man's table. Jesus even adds a detail that showed just how low this guy was, that dogs licked or sniffed at his wounds.

Why is the story of Lazarus important for Christians today?

This parable is both a jab at the religious leaders and hopes for those oppressed. The meaning of the rich man and Lazarus is a warning to those that aren't paying attention to the needs of others, that attitude has no place in God's kingdom.

True happiness is not found at the expense of others. Jesus is warning his audience, the religious leaders, that the treatment of others does not lead to where they think it does.

There is hope in this story for many as well. Many listening were the oppressed, the poor, the sick, the taken advantage of. For them this story is one of hope that one day their pain will end, and they will find the life they truly desire with God.

This parable, my dear parishioners, is designed to force us, the readers, to reflect on how we treat 'Lazarus-like people'. The rich man remains nameless so that we can place ourselves in his shoes.

Let us be honest with ourselves, we probably see a little of him in our own lives, don't we?

The story of the Rich man and Lazarus should lead us to the question: are we like him?

Who is the Lazarus among our family, neighbourhood or in our community?

Feast Days this Week

Tues 27 Sept—St Vincent de Paul—Born in France in 1581, he was a parish priest who worked for the apostolic renewal of the clergy, founding the Congregation of the Mission for missionary work in rural areas and for the formation of clergy. He was committed above all to the oppressed and disadvantaged and he founded the Daughters of Charity to work with the needy. He is remembered for his practical concern for the poor and the sick. He died in 1660

Thurs 29 Sept—Sts Michael, Gabriel & Raphael—In the Scriptures, each of the three angels is named as a messenger of God, entrusted with special divine missions on earth.

Fri 30 Sept—St Jerome—Born about 340 on Strido on the Adriatic coast, and while studying the classics became a hermit in Syria for a time and was ordained a priest. After settling in Bethlehem where he founded monasteries, he devoted himself to studying the Scriptures, writing, and teaching. Often irascible and intolerant, he is remembered for his asceticism and scholarship, and above all, for his incomparable service to the word of God. He died in 420.

A Reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke 16: 1-13

Now the poor man died and was carried away by angels to the bosom of Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried.

'In his torment in Hades he looked up and saw Abraham a long way off with Lazarus in his bosom. So he cried out, "Father Abraham, pity me and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am in agony in these flames." "My son," Abraham replied "remember that during your life good things come your way, just as bad things came the way of Lazarus. Now he is being comforted here while you are in agony. But that is not all: between us and you a great gulf has been fixed, to stop anyone, if he wanted to, crossing from our side to yours, and to stop any crossing from your side to ours."

'The rich man replied, "Father, I beg you then to send Lazarus to my father's house, since I have five brothers, to give them warning, so that they do not come to this place of torment too." "They have Moses and the prophets," said Abraham "let them listen to them." "Ah no, father Abraham," said the rich man "but if someone comes to them from the dead, they will repent." ThenAbraham said to him, "If they will not listen either to Moses or to the prophets, they will not be convinced even if someone should rise from the dead.""
