

Reflection... By Fr Jeronimo

"If you want you can cure me"

In Luke 17:11-19, we encounter the powerful story of Jesus healing ten lepers. As Jesus travels along the border between Samaria and Galilee, these ten men, suffering from a dreadful disease that ostracized them from society, call out to Him for mercy. Their cry reflects a deep yearning for healing and restoration, not just physically, but also socially and spiritually.

What stands out in this passage is the response of the lepers. They recognize Jesus as a source of hope and healing, demonstrating faith in His ability to transform their dire situation. When He instructs them to go show themselves to the priests, they obey without hesitation, and as they go, they are cleansed. This act of faith, stepping out in obedience before seeing the manifestation of their healing, is a profound lesson for us.

However, the story takes a deeper turn when only one of the ten returns to thank Jesus. This Samaritan, an outsider in more ways than one, not only receives physical healing but also returns to express gratitude. His response highlights an essential truth: gratitude is an integral part of our relationship with God. Jesus notes this man's return and asks, "Were not ten cleansed? Where are the nine?" This rhetorical question invites us to reflect on our own lives and the frequency with which we overlook gratitude for the blessings we receive.

The Samaritan's act of returning to give thanks is a model for us. It reminds us that while we may seek God's help in times of trouble, we must also remember to acknowledge His goodness and grace in our lives. Gratitude transforms our perspective, allowing us to see not just what we have received but also the depth of God's love for us.

Moreover, Jesus concludes with a powerful statement to the Samaritan: "Rise and go; your faith has made you well." This suggests that the healing received was not just physical but encompassed a fuller restoration of his being—a holistic healing that comes through faith and gratitude.

In our journey of faith, let us strive to be like the one leper who returned. Let us cultivate a heart of thanksgiving, recognizing the blessings in our lives, both big and small. Through gratitude, we can deepen our relationship with God and experience the fullness of healing and restoration that He offers.

First Reading from the second book of the Kings 5: 14-17

Naaman the leper went down and immersed himself seven times in the Jordan, as Elisha had told him to do. And his flesh became clean once more like the flesh of a little child. Returning to Elisha with his whole escort, he went in and stood before him. 'Now I know' he said, 'that there is no God in all the earth except in Israel. Now, please, accept a present from your servant.' But Elisha replied, 'As the Lord lives, whom I serve, I will accept nothing.' Naaman pressed him to accept, but he refused. Then Naaman said, 'Since your answer is "No," allow your servant to be given as much earth as two mules may carry, because your servant will no longer offer holocaust or sacrifice to any god except the Lord.'

Here is a saying that you can rely on: If we have died with him, then we shall live with him. If we hold firm, then we shall reign with him. If we disown him, then he will disown us. We may be unfaithful, but he is always faithful, for he cannot disown his own self.

They stood some way off and called to him, 'Jesus! Master! Take pity on us.' When he saw them he said, 'Go and show yourselves to the priests.' Now as they were going away they were cleansed. Finding himself cured, one of them turned back praising God at the top of his voice and threw himself at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. The man was a Samaritan. This made Jesus say, 'Were not all ten made clean? The other nine, where are they? It seems that no one has come back to give praise to God, except this foreigner.' And he said to the man, 'Stand up and go on your way. Your faith has saved you.'
