Reflection... By Fr Jeronimo

In today's Gospel, we find the parable of the persistent widow, a story that teaches us about perseverance in prayer and the nature of God's justice. The widow, facing an unjust judge who neither feared God, nor respect people, continually approaches him with her plea for justice. Despite his initial reluctance, the judge eventually grants her request, not out of compassion, but to avoid being worn down by her persistence.

We find in today's Gospel an insight that can help us in our Christian journey.

Encourage us to pray continuously: Jesus starts the parable by starting the need to pray always and not lose heart. It emphasizes that prayer should be a persistent part of our lives, even when answers seem delayed or absent. The widow's determination illustrates that faith is often tested through waiting.

The contrast between the unjust judge and God, reveals a crucial aspect of divine justice. If an unloving judge can save swayed by persistence, how much more will a loving God respond to the cries of his chosen ones? This invites us to trust in God's timing and in his ultimate justice, reminding us that he is attentive to our needs and concerns.

Today's parable concludes with an important question from Jesus: when the son of man comes, will he find faith on earth? This challenges us to reflect on our own faith and how it manifests in our lives. Are we persistent in our prayers? Do we trust that God hears us and working on our behalf?

Dear parishioner is an invitation to approach prayer with the same tenacity as the widow, trusting in God's goodness and justice. It reassures us that even in our struggles and frustrations, our voices matter to God. We pray that during this week we cultivate a spirit of perseverance in our prayers, confident that our faith will be met with divine response in God's perfect time.

First Reading from the book of Exodus

17 : 8 - 13

The Amalekites came and attacked Israel at Rephidim. Moses said to Joshua, 'Pick out men for yourself, and tomorrow morning march out to engage Amalek. I, meanwhile, will stand on the hilltop, the staff of God in my hand.' Joshua did as Moses told him and marched out to engage Amalek, while Moses and Aaron and Hur went up to the top of the hill. As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage; when he let his arms fall, the advantage went to Amalek. But Moses arms grew heavy, so they took a stone and put it under him and on this he sat, Aaron and Hur supporting his arms, one on one side, one on the other; and his arms remained firm till sunset. With the edge of the sword Joshua cut down Amalek and his people.
