

Reflection... By Fr Jeronimo

What is faith? How are we responding to this faith that is reveal to us?

I would like to begin this reflection this week by recalling Mother Teresa of Calcutta, who said, "Faith is a gift from God. Without it, there would be no life, and our work, to be fruitful and beautiful, must be built on faith. Love and faith go hand in hand and complement each other." Today, the word of God unites us in a reflection on faith. A faith that is not theory, but perseverance in trials, boldness in mission, and humility in service.

St. Paul, in the second reading, invites Timothy to rekindle the gift received. We, too, amid a weary and secularized world, are called to revive the call of faith in our families, churches, and communities in which we live.

Let us remember, dear brothers and sisters, that authentic faith does not seek applause or rewards; it translates into concrete gestures of love and justice. Faith is a response to that salvific plan that God has laid out throughout time and has culminated in Jesus Christ. Therefore, Christian faith must be mature and free, because the freer our response to this revelation of God, the more faith we will have. Faith helps us establish a personal relationship with God, who has revealed everything to us in the person of Jesus Christ.

Faith, dear brothers and sisters, is not magic or a guarantee of immediate success. It is the certainty that God is within us, even when everything seems to be crumbling. It is a small seed that, planted with humility and courage, transforms our lives.

First Reading from the prophet Habakkuk 1:2-3,2:2-4

How long, Lord, am I to cry for help while you will not listen; to cry 'Oppression!' in your ear and you will not save? Why do you set injustice before me, why do you look on where there is tyranny? Outrage and violence, this is all I see, all is contention, and discord flourishes. Then the Lord answered and said, 'Write the vision down, inscribe it on tablets to be easily read, since this vision is for its own time only: eager for its own fulfilment, it does not deceive; if it comes slowly, wait, for come it will, without fail. See how he flags, he whose soul is not at rights, but the upright man will live by his faithfulness.'

Second Reading from the second letter of St Paul to Timothy 1: 6 - 8, 13 - 14

I am reminding you to fan into a flame the gift that God gave you when I laid my hands on you. God's gift was not a spirit of timidity, but the Spirit of power, and love, and self-control. So you are never to be ashamed of witnessing to the Lord, or ashamed of me for being his prisoner; but with me, bear the hardships for the sake of the Good News, relying on the power of God. Keep as your pattern the sound teaching you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. You have been trusted to look after something precious; guard it with the help of the Holy Spirit who lives in us.

Must he be grateful to the servant for doing what he was told? So with you: when you have done all you have been told to do, say, "We are merely servants: we have done no more than our duty."
