Reflection... By Fr Jeronimo

This reflection on the Thirty-third Sunday of the Year encapsulates the essence of what Jesus conveys about the end of time and the importance of living a life of faith and integrity. As the church year concludes, it serves as a poignant reminder to focus on our spiritual readiness and the quality of our lives.

The imagery of the Temple's destruction resonates deeply, symbolizing not just a historical event but the fragility of worldly structures and securities. It calls attention to the reality that, like the disciples, we are often preoccupied with the unknowns of the future, including the end of the world. In doing so, it highlights the tendency of some to exploit fear and uncertainty for their own ends, which can lead to misguided beliefs about the end times.

The key message is that our preparedness for Christ's return is intrinsically linked to our current choices and actions. It emphasizes that living a life aligned with God's values—characterized by honesty, integrity, and selflessness—is crucial. Our present efforts to cultivate a relationship with God shape our future and determine how we stand before Him.

The passage reassures us of God's unwavering presence and support, even amid life's challenges. It encourages us to maintain hope and to remember that trials are temporary and can lead to a more profound fulfillment in God's promise of salvation.

Ultimately, this reflection invites us to be proactive in our faith, to embody hope, and to act as beacons of light in a world that often feels dark and uncertain. It reminds us that our role as messengers of hope is vital, and our relationship with God will guide us through the difficulties we face.

And they put to him this question: 'Master,' they said, 'when will this happen, then, and what sign will there be that this is about to take place?' 'Take care not to be deceived,' he said, 'because many will come using my name and saying, "I am he" and, "The time is near at hand." Refuse to join them. And when you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened, for this is something that must happen but the end is not soon.' Then he said to them, 'Nation will fight against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes and plagues and famines here and there; there will be fearful sights and great signs from heaven. 'But before all this happens, men will seize you and persecute you; they will hand you over to the synagogues and to imprisonment, and bring you before kings and governors because of my name – and that will be your opportunity to bear witness. Keep this carefully in mind: you are not to prepare your defence, because I myself shall give you an eloquence and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to resist or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, relations and friends; and some of you will be put to death. You will be hated by all men on account of my name, but not a hair of your head will be lost. Your endurance will win you your lives.'
