

# Reflection... By Fr Jeronimo

### WE ARE God's Dwelling

Dear brothers and sisters, on this Sunday when the Church celebrates the anniversary of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, I express, along with you, the deepest reverence to our God and Lord, who dwells in this venerable temple. God dwells within His Church! When the temple was erected in this place — and it happened for the first time in the time of Emperor Constantine — it was dedicated solely to God. Indeed, churches are built to be dedicated to God, to give Him alone His particular property and His dwelling among us, who are His people. From our ancestors in faith, we receive the certainty of the revealed truth, according to which God wants to dwell among us. He wants to be with us. What else is testified by the history of the Patriarchs and Moses? And what else does Christ, our Lord and Savior, especially testify to, who has been, from the beginning, the Patron of the Church in Lateran? Yes, we have recently heard His words spoken to the inhabitants of Jerusalem and to the pilgrims who had come to visit Solomon's temple: "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up" (John 2:19). Christ had gone up to the temple of Jerusalem along with the others and — as we have heard — had driven out the people selling oxen, sheep, and doves, and the money changers sitting there. And then, in response to the harsh reaction of the Master of Nazareth, to the words He had spoken on that occasion, "Do not make my Father's house a house of trade" (John 2:16), this question was asked: "What sign do you show us for doing these things?" (John 2:18). Christ's response raised a feeling of suspicion: "Forty-six years it took to build this temple, and will you raise it up in three days?" (John 2:20). Only those closest to Christ were aware that what He had said manifested His filial "zeal" for the house of the Father, a zeal that consumed Him (cf. John 2:14). And they, the disciples, understood later, when Christ rose, that by driving out the merchants from the temple of Jerusalem, He was thinking above all of the "temple of His body" (John 2:21). Thus, on the day we celebrate the annual remembrance of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, which is the mother of all Churches, we wish to express the highest reverence for this "dwelling of God with us" (cf. Revelation 21:3), professing that it represents Christ crucified and risen Himself. Christ, our Paschal Lamb; because through Him, in Him, and with Him, we have access to the Father in the Holy Spirit; through Him, in Him, and with Him, God Himself, in the inscrutable mystery of His Trinitarian Life, draws near to us to be with us, to dwell among us.

## First Reading from the prophet Ezekiel 47: 1 - 2, 8 - 9, 12

The angel brought me to the entrance of the Temple, where a stream came out from under the Temple threshold and flowed eastwards, since the Temple faced east. The water flowed from under the right side of the Temple, south of the altar. He took me out by the north gate and led me right round outside as far as the outer east gate where the water flowed out on the right-hand side. The man went to the east holding his measuring line and measured off a thousand cubits; he then made me wade across the stream; the water reached my ankles. He measured off another thousand and made me wade across the stream again; the water reached my knees. He measured off another thousand and made me wade across again; the water reached my waist. He measured off another thousand; it was now a river which I could not cross; the stream had swollen and was now deep water, a river impossible to cross. He then said, 'Do vou see, son of man?' He took me further, then brought me back to the bank of the river. When I got back, there were many trees on each bank of the river. He said, 'This water flows east down to the Arabah and to the sea; and flowing into the sea it makes its waters wholesome. Wherever the river flows, all living creatures teeming in it will live. Fish will be very plentiful, for wherever the water goes it brings health, and life teems wherever the river flows. Along the river, on either bank, will grow every kind of fruit tree with leaves that never wither and fruit that never fails; they will bear new fruit every month, because this water comes from the sanctuary. And their fruit will be good to eat and the leaves medicinal.'

## (R.) The waters of the river gladden the city of God

- 1. God is for us a refuge and strength, a helper close at hand, in time of distress: so we shall not fear though the earth should rock, though the mountains fall into the depths of the sea. (R.)
- 2. The waters of a river give joy to God's city, the holy place where the Most High dwells. God is within, it cannot be shaken; God will help it at the dawning of the day. (R.)

## Second Reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians 3:9-11, 16-17

For the foundation, nobody can lay any other than the one which has already been laid, that is Jesus Christ. Didn't you realise that you were God's temple and that the Spirit of God was living among you? If anybody should destroy the temple of God, God will destroy him, because the temple of God is sacred; and you are that temple.

## A Reading from the holy Gospel according to John 2:13-22

Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market'. Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, 'What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up'. The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said.
